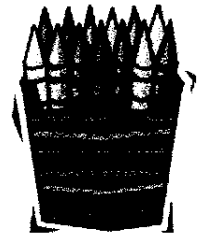

MAP Assessments

Your students worked very hard on the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) assessment in Reading last week! On January 22nd & 23rd, students will take the MAP Math assessment. The only preparation needed is a good night's rest and a hearty breakfast!

Phonics Unit

Students will begin working in Foundations Unit 9 this week. This unit reviews reading and spelling patterns previously taught and introduces for these vowel teams: **ai, ay, ee, ea, ey, oi,** and **oy**. Example unit words include *dick, chunk,* and *sniffs*. In addition to the trick words taught previously, students must also read, write and spell these trick words:

TRICK WORDS (Sight Words)

1. say
2. says
3. see
4. between
5. each

Eureka and Xtra Math Notes

We will continue work in Module 3, Measurement & Data, in Eureka Math. Students will be measuring items with centimeter cubes and comparing the length of several items. Please have students continue to practice addition and subtraction fluency at www.xtramath.org.

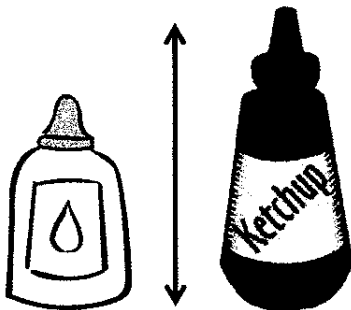

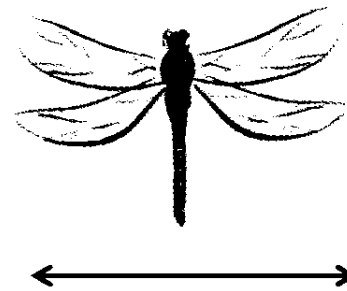

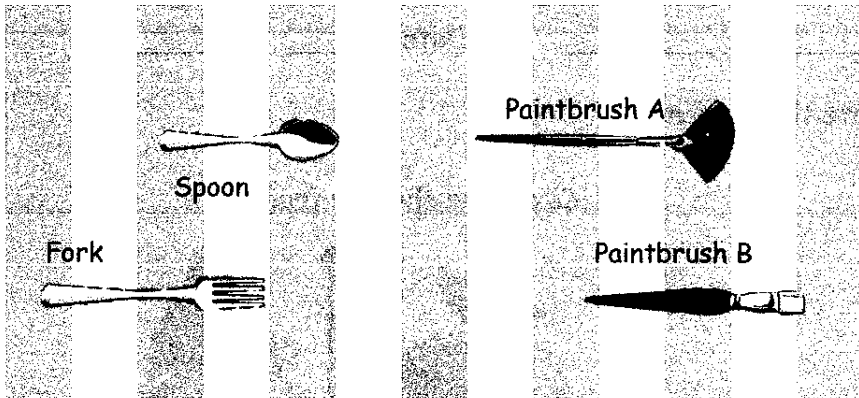
