Phonics Unit 7

Students will be assessed in Fundations Unit 7 this week. In this unit, students spell and read words with glued sounds —ang, -ing, -ong, -ung, ank, ink, onk, and unk and add suffix —s to words with these glued sounds. Examples include bang, bank, pink and chunks. In addition to the trick words taught previously, students must also read, write and spell these trick words:


